




Funding for community projects: The Localities Awards are open for this financial year. If your group or organisation needs a grant (from £250 to approx. £1000), please contact one of us for an application form. Forms are also available at <u>www.midsuffolk.gov.uk</u> and completed forms must be returned to one of us and not directly to MSDC.

Nationally significant infrastructure project (NSIP): A 750 acre solar farm NSIP near Mendlesham has been proposed. This proposal will be determined at a national level for the Planning Inspectorate. The Secretary of State makes the final decision. MSDC are just a consultee, in the same way a resident or parish council is, but we have requested more clarity about certain aspects of the application including connection to the grid, infrastructure and the effect on communities, businesses, heritage and the environment.

Anti-social behaviour: We have heard of some reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) in the area which we have raised with the Community Safety Officer at Mid Suffolk. They do need to hear directly from residents so if you witness any ASB or have concerns, please report these to Mid Suffolk at <u>www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/report-online</u> (If there is evidence of criminality, this should be reported to the Police.)

Devolution in Suffolk: A reminder that Suffolk County Council's consultation on Devolution is open until 26th May. See <u>www.suffolk.gov.uk</u> for details.

Haughley Playing Field and Pavilion News King George's Field, Haughley charity No. 193471

Play Equipment repairs are underway thanks to: Haughley Block Plant donation, Pride in your place grant, District Councilor locality grant and Haughley Parish Council. I think you will all agree our playing field looks great. This is a combination of paid contactors and volunteer work. Unfortunately, due to a delay in parts being delivered some repairs will not be done until the end of June.

PICK UP YOUR DOG POO. Most people do tidy up after their dogs, but we are seeing an increase in the amount of poo being left on the field. This is **UNACCEPTABLE.** This is a charity field for everyone's pleasure. The football clubs are all run by volunteers, and they are forced to add extra checks to the pitches before matches. It has been known for matches to be paused to clear up dog mess that has not been spotted in advance. Dogs should be kept on leads and their poo removed by the owner or dog walker.

Other news - We are liaising with the Plug in Suffolk scheme to see if we can get an EV charging point based in our car park for community use. A small working party has started cleaning the paths and Patio around the pavilion. We will continue this and move onto other areas to spruce up the pavilion whilst we work on the broader plans for refurbishment.

The Easter Egg Hunt 24th March run by the Scout group saw the Playing Field buzzing with activity. It was a lovely afternoon and great to see so many families enjoying a walk around the field, then staying to play.

Grassroots Football. We have 8 Youth teams of varying ages. At our meeting on 2nd April we heard all 8 teams have won their matches for the previous three weeks. The adult teams are also seeing an increase in support on match days which is wonderful.

Bowls season has begun. The bowls club is thriving and considering a waiting list due to numbers.

Issues raised during the public forum: The frequency of fly tipping. Whilst we live within 2 miles of a free household waste recycling point which only requires booking a slot, we still get frequent incidents of fly tipping. DC/24/01462- Proposal: Notification of Works to Trees in a Conservation Area - Fell 1 No. Silver Birch (G1), Reduce crown of 1 No. Cherry and 1 No. Oak (G1) by approx 2-2.5m and shape. Location: 50 Old Street, Haughley, Stowmarket, Suffolk IP14 3NX - supported

DC/24/01464 - Proposal: Full Planning Application - Conversion of agricultural building to form 1No dwelling. Location: Old Hall Farm, Haughley Green, Haughley, Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 3RR - supported

DC/24/01518 - Proposal: Application for Listed Building Consent - Remove existing render to front elevation and re-render using Warmcote lime plaster, carrying out repairs as necessary, rerender and repaint. Location: 32 Old Street, Haughley, Stowmarket, Suffolk IP14 3NX – support.

Junior football pitch on Bloor's homes estate – a report was received from Parkers Pitches regarding the suitability of the surface and potential work required so that Council could consider the offer of a commuted sum to cover line marking and goal posts. Attention was drawn to the volume of stones and debris close to the surface and the work that would be required to make it suitable to reseed for a safe playing surface. It was agreed to go back to Bloors to say we will consider a relevant commuted sum once the ground is in a suitable state to be used as a pitch.

Allotments parking area improvement – After a meeting with a representative from John Sisks and Sons it was agreed that they would clear the area, leave a small section to allow wood chippings to be kept and hard surface a section to allow tenants to drive vehicles onto the site. They are keen to recycle materials from the A14 project and the work would be completed by the time they have finished the improvement works.

Miscellaneous – concerns raised regarding the expansion of Woolpit Business Park and the potential increase in traffic needing to link with the A14. Play equipment repairs have been delayed due to delay in parts being available.

A large proportion of this month's agenda was given over to the necessary financial year end checking of documents to submit for audit and other official forms. Not the most exciting of tasks but nevertheless very important.

ELMSWELL HISTORY GROUP

Our April meeting welcomed back Jacquie Norman for her second talk on "Tudor *Costumes*" which included wonderful replica samples of the elaborate costumes made by Jacquie herself. She explained that these clothes were made from natural fibres such as wool, silk, hemp, and linen although those for the lower classes would have been made from canvas (similar to denim). Durance was a tightlywoven fabric which was fire retardant so was used for aprons. The triangular area between Bury St Edmunds, Clare and East Bergholt was famous for its production of broadcloth (a dense woven cloth historically made of wool). Its manufacture originated in Flanders but, when the French protestant Huguenots were persecuted there in the 16th and 17th centuries, they migrated to East Anglia and passed on their skills to local weavers. The strictly-observed Sumptuary Laws governed what everyone could (and could not!) wear and were based on earnings, i.e. designed to keep everyone "in their place". There was some wonderful vocabulary from this period, e.g. "farthingale" (hooped petticoat), "kirtle" (dress), "carbage" (cloth offcuts used to stuff a bustle, being a cushion worn by women to hold out their dress below the waist at the back: this word being the origin of the American garbage), "pickerdills" and "tassets" (flaps at the hip on men's jackets), "gilligaskins" (straight "venetians" men's trousers). (like Bermuda shorts). tubular and "pantoffles" (oversized slippers for outside wear). Confusingly, Tudor skirts were called petticoats! It was basically just the linen underwear which was washed: otherwise everything else was merely brushed after each occasion, while any stains were spot-cleaned with special natural lotions by very skilled and knowledgeable laundrywomen. Hooks and eyes were invented by the Tudors, and reputable ladies were laced into their garments by straight-lacing (not crossed lacing), hence a strait-laced lady. When Catherine of Aragon became Henry VIII's first wife, she introduced Spanish fashions to England, including black-dyed tunics for the men (think Rowan Atkinson in the Blackadder t.v. series) which only the very wealthy could afford because black was an extremely heavy and expensive dye. This was the time just after the Spanish Armada in the 1580-90s. Apparently, the average Tudor male was 5'7" tall – no wonder Henry VIII at 6'2" made such a commanding figure!

WETHERDEN PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on Monday 25th March 2024

Present: Cllr Duncan Perry, Cllr Richard Thurman, Cllr Stephanie Hensley, District Cllr Rachel Eburne, District Cllr Janet Pearson, County Cllr Andrew Stringer, Christine Mason (Clerk) and three members of the public

Apologies for absence: Cllr Stacey Lascelles. Cllr Andy Lewis.

Declarations of Interest: None declared.

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting: The minutes of the meeting of Monday 26th February 2024 were approved and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

District Councillor Rachel Eburne's report

Councils of Mid Suffolk and Babergh, with a Green Party administration, have been jointly awarded Council of the Year for their collaboration with different partners, working to improve services and focus on communities; as part of the Joint Local Plan part 2, all parish and town councils have been invited to complete a questionnaire regarding services and facilities present in each area; a new rural transport grants scheme with monies available of £600,000 has just been launched to provide passenger transport across the district, deadline 15th April.

County Councillor Andrew Stringer's report

A third Ofsted inspection in a row has led to the resignation of the Cabinet members for SEND; a new director of Children and Young people has been recruited and has experience of turning around local authorities that are underperforming in SEND provision; devolution consultation is now open for public consultation, if agreed it will mean the leader of SCC would be directly elected by people in Suffolk; Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects proposed in Suffolk continue to increase, but as with all Nsip's the government makes the decision with County, District and Parish being consultees in the process.

Local issues: The dangerous pothole at the junction of Warren Lane will be repaired on Tuesday 26th March; the timetable for the Quarry planning application is imminent.

Public Participation

Matters brought to the attention of the parish council included the ongoing problem of vehicles speeding through the village, Cllr Hensley suggested a temporary third speed indicator device that sits on the verge is hired, however, support from the local authorities to bring in the police is essential. To highlight speeding, data from the speed camera needs to be downloaded and sent onto the appropriate authority; unclear signage needs to be reinstated as this could prevent motorists from being prosecuted; relating to concerns raised by the village hall in respect of the abuse of the car park on match days. Tony (Scouse) from the Youth Football Team informed the meeting he has the opportunity for 40 tons of graded hardcore to be delivered free of charge to the village hall car park. With a tight deadline and permission required, a conference call following the parish council meeting has been arranged by Cllr Hensley between Keith Watts and Tony (Scouse).

Clerk's report

The Clerk confirmed the Locality Budget Grant of £1000 towards the Pavilion refurbishment has been received. A thank you was given to Cllr Eburne. No further matters to report.

To receive finance reports and authorise payments

The finance report was agreed and payments as per the schedule were approved.

To appoint the internal auditor for the financial year 2023-2024

Councillors approved the appointment of Trevor Brown to undertake the 2023/4 internal audit – all in agreement.

Planning applications validated since the last meeting

A planning appeal has been submitted for the erection of 2No. single storey residential dwellings with garages and new vehicular access (following infill of existing swimming pool), The Willows, Park Road, Wetherden, Stowmarket, Suffolk IP14 3J. The parish council objected to the original application.

Website

Still awaiting information from local groups for adding to the website. New Councillor gov.uk emails have been activated.

Flooding under the bridge at Ashfield Road/Blocked ditches

Flooding now cleared. Feedback received states flooding is due to the bank on either side not being retained by grass and is just soil. Contact has been made with the landowners and is being progressed by the Highways Enforcement Agency. No further update at present.

Townlands car park resurfacing

Highways are still keen to support local projects, and with the car park now drying out, a site survey will be undertaken and possibly some works scheduled within the next two weeks. Cllr Perry to maintain regular contact with Highways.

To consider common/playing field/projects and concerns

The whole of the ditch next to the footpath by the football pitch has been dredged and some brambles removed, the top section is still to be done. James Bevan to be contacted regarding clearing out his section of ditch.

A working group to be set up to sort out areas near the tennis courts and to make good the field when the football season is finished.

Urgent matters to be brought to the attention of the council : None. Date of next meeting:

Annual Parish Meeting 13th May 2024 at 7pm followed by the Annual General Meeting at 7.30pm.

At Orchard Barn, everything we do has care for the environment at its heart, which is why we were so delighted to win the Waste Reduction and Recycling Award at the Creating the Greenest County Awards recently. The awards highlight environmental excellence in meeting the challenge of climate change and protecting our environment, from across Suffolk. Here are just a few of the things we do on our site:



- We have mixed tons of builders' waste clay from foundations with locally sourced straw, to make wall insulation for our new education building's walls.
- We harvest rainwater from our roofs for all our needs we do not have mains water at our site.
- Our water free toilet saved 21,077L/5,568 gallons of water in the last year, whilst also providing bio-nutrients for our compost heaps and gardens.
- We have no mains electricity our solar panels power our laptop for educational presentations and charges mobile phones.
- In very cold weather our meeting room is heated by our Masonry Stove, made from clay lump blocks and earth mortar. It is fuelled by seasoned off cuts and by products from wood working on site.
- We use a Kelly Kettle to heat water for drinks, washing up etc which is fuelled by small sticks left from wood working.

Learning from the past how to build a greener future

I recently started a new job where my boss has told me I'll have to work on bank holidays. This was never the case in my ^{Mid Suffolk} old job. Can my employer really make me work on a public holiday, and should I get paid extra if I do?

Unfortunately, when it comes to bank holidays, whether staff have to work is up to their employer, and you don't have to be paid more if you do. The situation will vary from job to job and may depend on several factors such as whether your place of work is open on bank holidays, your hours of work and crucially, what your contract says.

Look at your contract, if you have one, to find out what your personal situation is. Your contract might say you will always get bank holidays off, but it might say you may sometimes be required to work them or will always be required to work. But if your contract says you get bank holidays off you shouldn't be asked to work.

Your contract might say something like: "In addition to bank and public holidays, your annual entitlement to holidays is X days". This means you get public holidays off in addition to your annual leave entitlement, but it might not mean you're entitled to take the specific days off. You may be required to work a bank holiday, in which case you should get another day off instead.

Alternatively, it might say something like: "Your annual holiday entitlement (inclusive of bank and public holidays) is X days" - this means you have to take bank holidays off as part of your annual leave entitlement. Bank holidays will either be deducted from your annual leave allowance (so you'll have to book all bank holidays as paid time off) or counted as additional holiday days.

A common misunderstanding around bank holidays is that employers have to pay you extra for working them. This is not the case. Unless your contract says you'll be paid extra you will just be paid your normal amount. If your contract says you are entitled to bank holidays but you're asked to work, you should be able to take a different day off in lieu. Your employer must follow what's set out in your contract. If they don't, you should raise this with them.

If you don't have a contract, the legal default position is that your employer can tell you when you can or can't take time off. If you'd like to request a bank holiday off, use the normal method for requesting time off.

If you find you need to resolve an issue with your employer, first ask for an informal chat, where you can raise your concerns. If this doesn't get you anywhere, you may need to raise a formal grievance. If you need advice on this, contact Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk.




